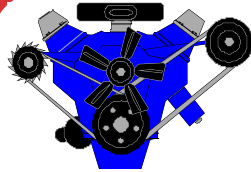

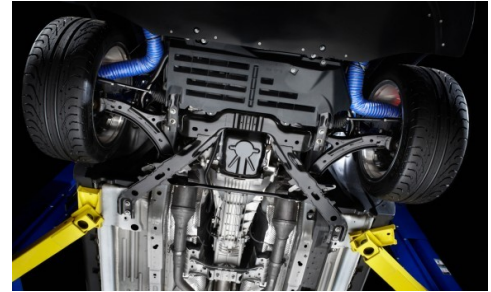

Additionally, Ford is launching an even more exclusive "Boss 302 Laguna Seca" model for the harder-core buyer.
